Hearing Impairment is a hidden disability, which cannot be observed unless one tries to communicate with the hearing impaired person, because of this, many time this problem is just overlooked or ignored in initially years of its onset. Due to **lack of awareness** about hearing impairment, its causes, its prevention & intervention this problem becomes a **DISABILITY**. If Hearing Impairment is diagnosed at the earliest it can be prevented to make a person handicap.

This ignorance among the people make it difficult to understand the needs of a hearing impaired person because of which the person gets deprived of proper Education, Information and Training.

Delhi Foundation of Deaf Women (Estb. in 1973) works to, **REHABILITATE, EDUCATE, VOCATIONNALLY TRAIN DEAF** & also to create **AWARENESS** about Hearing Impairment. We help them to grow: **Emotionally, Spiritually, Personally and educationally** also.

Delhi Foundation of Deaf Women initially started as a club but gradually it converted in to an organization cum institute to train deaf women. The concept behind starting the projects and courses was to help deaf women to become Self- Dependent and Confident. **Delhi Foundation of Deaf Women is the FIRST ORGANISATION IN DELHI** to establish these types of courses for deaf.

11. To Provide Matrimonial Assistance to Deaf.
